Climate Adaptation and Resilience Strategies (CLARS): Socio-Economic Vulnerabilities among Urban Migrants in the Lake Victoria Basin Region

This research workshop for the CLARS project aims to prepare the empirical research for CLARS, with a focus on work in East Africa. The main goal is to refine the research design and methodologies for site-specific work packages. The workshop will also foster collaboration and strategic planning among project partners in the region to ensure the successful implementation of empirical work packages, maximize the impact of findings across the Lake Victoria Basin, and promote interdisciplinary relationships among researchers, policy stakeholders, and local communities. Additionally, the workshop will validate the project's approach with input from national and regional stakeholders ensuring alignment with policy frameworks and local development needs, ultimately advancing sustainable climate-resilient development in the region.

Day one of the workshop is dedicated to internal discussions among CLARS project partners. Day two, to which external stakeholders are invited, is dedicated to outreach and improving research uptake. The agenda aims to place CLARS research objectives among existing research and development efforts on the topic of climate-induced migration in Eastern Africa, with an emphasis on Tanzania. Presenters are invited to reflect on the wider implications of the CLARS research within the existing state of the literature and relevant policy processes.
